The preferred starting date is **fall 2025**, though we offer **flexibility** for the right candidate.

Our group investigates topics such as the economics of the public administration, tax enforcement and evasion, distributional preferences, and long-term effects of public policy, especially in declining regions. We apply **state-of-the-art quantitative methods**, including quasi-experimental and experimental techniques such as field and survey experiments. Our work draws on diverse data sources - from large administrative datasets to unique historical records.
